Make your own 3-D paper pumpkin

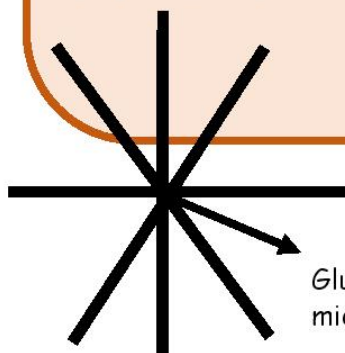
What you will need:

- Orange Paper (you can colour your plain paper orange if you don't have orange paper)
- Colouring pen or pencils
 - Scissors
 - Glue

To start with you need to find your paper you are going to use, if you have orange paper you can use this or you can use plain paper and colour it in yourself if you don't have orange paper. Once you have found the paper you will need to use your scissors and cut it into strips, you can cut them horizontal or vertical depending how big you want your pumpkin to be (See diagram in the bottom left for measurements). Once you have cut out a few strips of paper you can start making your 3-D pumpkin. You need to overlap each strip and putting glue only in the middle of each strip (See diagram below to see the layout of the strips). Next you will need to add glue to each end of the strip and then stick opposites to each other, so the top will be stuck to the bottom point. When you have stuck them all you should be left with an orange 3-D paper pumpkin. The last step is to draw a stalk on some paper and colour it green, cut it out and stick it to the top of the pumpkin and there you have your own 3-D paper pumpkin.

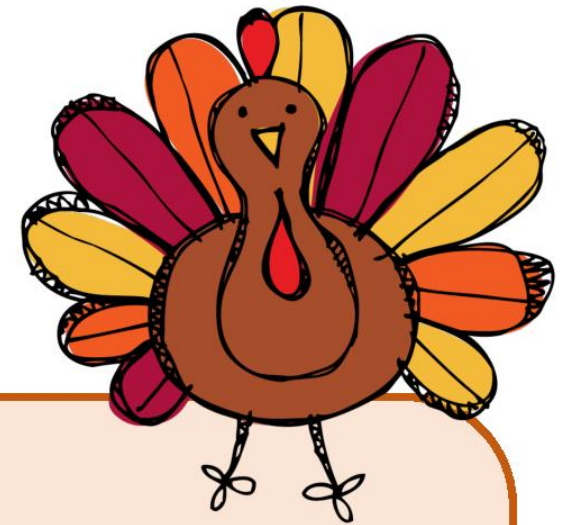

- Orange, Yellow, red and brown paper (If you don't have the colours don't worry you can use plain paper and colour it yourself)
 - Scissors
 - Glue
 - Colouring Pens or pencils



Make your own handprint turkey



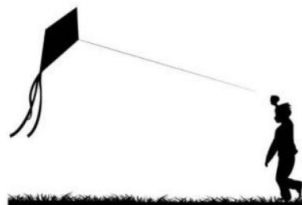
To begin making your own handprint turkey you first need to get your paper, on the red, yellow and orange paper you will want to draw around your hand and cut them out, you will need one of each colour at least. Next you need to make the turkey body so on some brown paper you will want to draw your outline of the turkey and don't forget to add some of the facial features. Now you need to cut out the body and stick all your bits together. First you need to start with the handprints you don't want to stick them on top of each other but in a fan shape, once you have done this you can stick the body of the turkey in the palm of your hands (the middle). Add any finishes touches you like and then you have made your own handprint turkey.

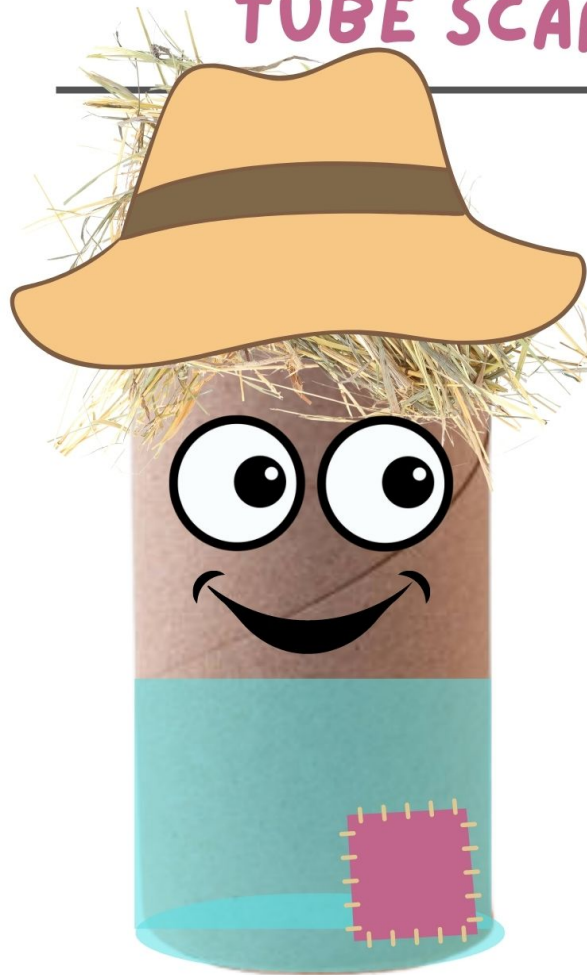
