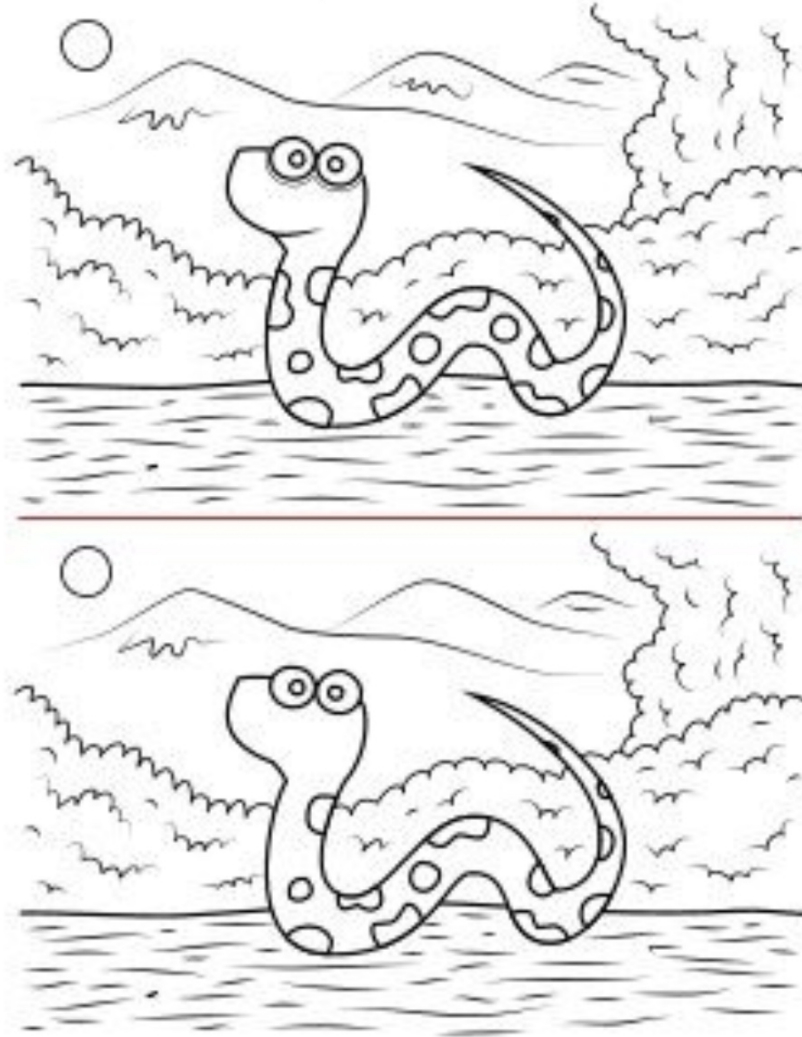

Spot the difference Snake

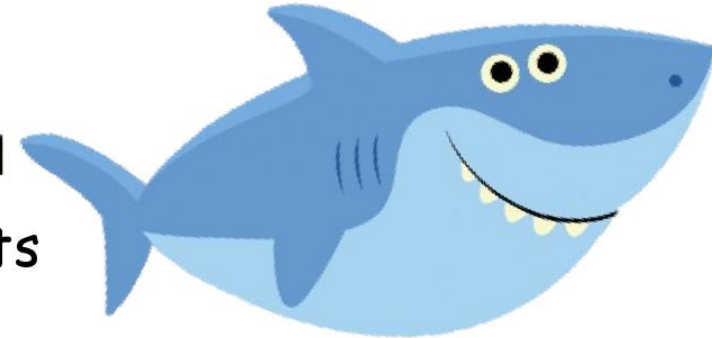


What you will need:

- Old Newspaper
- Paper
- Scissors
- Glue
- Colouring Pens



Newspaper shark arts and crafts



To start making your own newspaper shark begin by finding some old newspapers that you may have lying around the house, once you have found some pick a page and you want to draw an arc shape on the paper this is going to create your shark (It should look like the shape in the bottom left but with more of a point at the top). Once you have done this you will want to cut it out using some scissors, and then glue it on to some paper. Now you need to add the facial features of the shark, so you want to add its mouth with all its teeth and its eyes. Finally, you can begin making the background of the shark, you can draw some dark blue waves at the bottom of it so it looks like it is in the sea and then you can draw the background such as some sky clouds or anything you like.

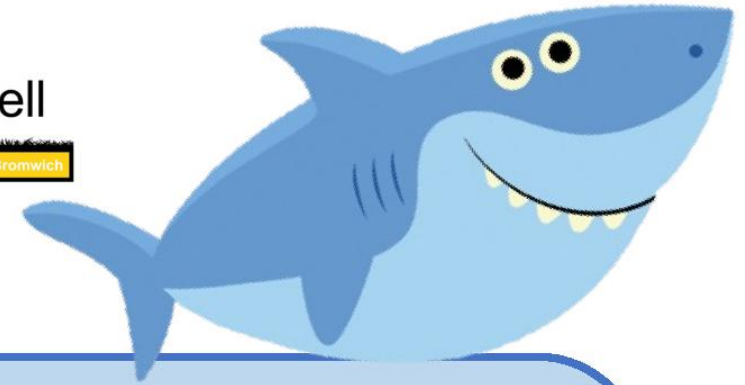

Paper plate shark craft



To begin with you need a paper plate and you will need to paint it grey, once you have done this you will need to wait for it to dry. While it's drying you can make the fins and the facial features of the shark. On some paper you will need to draw a large mouth for the shark with all its pointy teeth, you will also need to draw its eyes out as well (if you have large googly eyes you could use these instead). The final thing you will need to also draw out the fins for the shark. When your paper plate has dried you can add all your details to it and there you will have your own finished paper plate shark.
