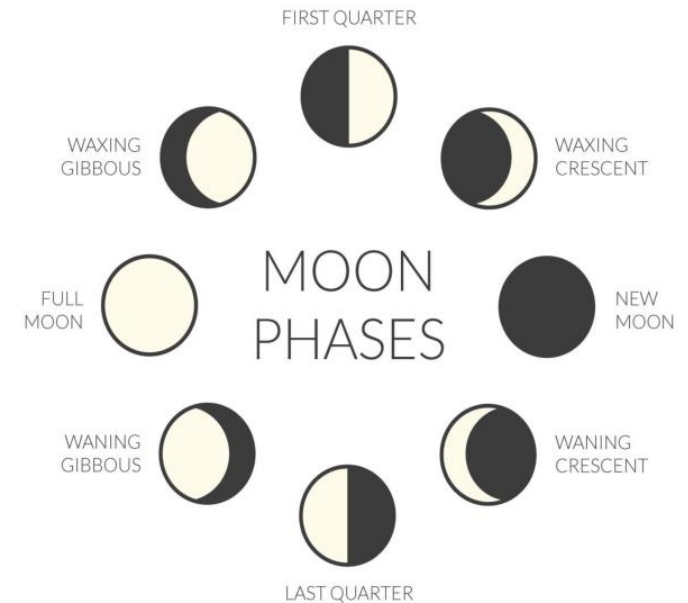
What you will need:

Make your own moon phases craft

To start with on a piece of paper you will want to draw the earth, you will want to draw a circles and add your green islands and the blue sea in the rest of the spaces, make sure your earth will fit in the middle of the paper plate. When you have done this cut it out and stick it in the middle of your paper plate. Next you will need to make all of the moon phases, to do this you will need to draw the different shapes of the moons (you can see them below and the names) Once you have drawn out all the moons you can cut them out and put them around the edge of your paper plate in order. Then all you need to do is put some string or ribbon around your paper plate so you can hang it up

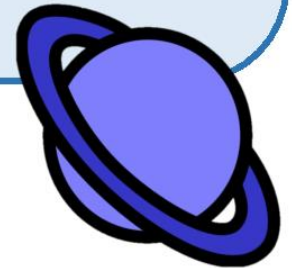
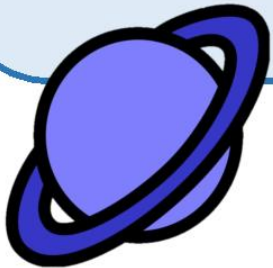

Make your own planet decoration

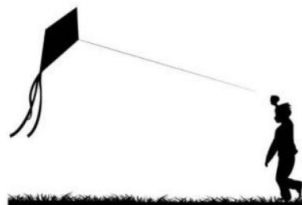
To start with you need to grab your paper plate and cut out the middle of your paper plate so you are left with a ring-shaped paper plate. Next you need to start designing your planets, to do this use some plain paper and draw your planets on there, you can draw the traditional planets, or you can create your own solar system of planets if you like. Once you have done this you can cut them out, then you need to move onto the background. On the paper plate ring you need to make it look like a night and star filled sky. You can use a dark blue paint to paint it, or you can colour it using pens or pencils. When you have finished doing the background you can stick your planet around the plate. Then all that's left to do is add some string or ribbon to it so you can hang it up somewhere.

First cut out a section of your paper plate to make a shape to match the example. Then decorate your moon with anything you can find, we painted ours and added star stickers!

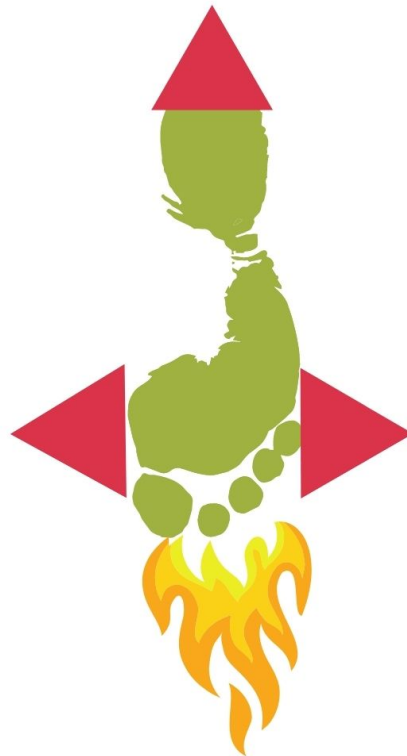
