Cotton Wool Paper Plate Snow People

To start with you will need to get your paper plate and use your scissors to cut out the middle of the paper plate, when you have done this, you can get your cotton wool and begin to cover the ring with cotton wool make sure to leave a little space at the top of your paper plate to stick the head. Once you have covered the paper plate wait for it to dry. While it is drying you can make the head, on some paper draw a round circle and add the face of your snowman onto it, you can also use the paper to make things like a hat and scarf or other accessories for your snow person. When you have completed all parts, the final thing is to stick the head on the body, and you have made your own cotton wool snow person

Christmas Reef Making

What you need: bare and flexible branches or metal wire, string, green leaves and branches, and any additional decorations you want (ribbon, Ivy, bells, lights, pine cones etc.)

1. Collect some green plant cuttings and branches to make your reef.
2. Make your frame using either some branches or wire. Bend the branches into a circle and tie them together. You want to tie lots of knots across the frame and have different branches over lapping, to make a strong shape.
3. Then tie on and weave in your green branches and leaves to the frame so it starts to bulk out, followed by any other decorations you want to add. You can also tie on a loop with your string if you want to hang it up.
